The Simply Scored Borders Scoring Plate takes Simply Scored in a new direction—a direction that's curvy, wavy, scallopy. Unlike most other scoring plates that keep everything uniformly straight, the new Borders Scoring Plate overflows with curvaceous designs to let you prettify plain cardstock.


Most of the designs span the 12-1/2" x 12-1/2" plate, making them just right for embossing the entire border of a scrapbook page. But you can also use smaller sections on smaller projects, such as card fronts and tags.

It's so easy to use: layer the plate, the cardstock, and the clear overlay that's included with the plate, and then trace. The cut designs on the overlay line up with the designs on the plate, so as you trace through the overlay, the stylus will stay in the plate's groove.

You'll love how this scoring plate expands your design options. It's an easy way to get an embossed look without a Big Shot. Trace a single line for a simple look or stack multiple lines together for a custom design. If you don't have a Simply Scored tool, this plate is your reason for getting one! 📦

do it yourself

GLASS ART

YOU DON'T HAVE TO SEARCH HIGH AND LOW TO FIND THE PERFECT GLASSWARE IN JUST THE RIGHT COLORS. A LITTLE TINTED PAINT IS ALL IT TAKES.

Breathe new life into old glassware with just a few items: vases or bottles, acrylic paint, and Classic Stampin' Ink®. (If you don't have old glassware, thrift shops and yard sales usually sell glassware for next to nothing.)

How-to:

- Wash your vase and let it dry completely before starting.
- Mix white acrylic paint with Classic Stampin' Ink. Cheap acrylic paint will work fine. The amount of ink you use will depend on how bold you want the color to be. We used four parts paint to one part ink.
- Pour the tinted paint into the clean vase and slowly roll it around until the inside is completely coated. Turn the vase upside-down for about five minutes so the rest of the paint can drip out.
- To dry the vase quickly, place it in a cold oven and turn the heat to 325 degrees F/162 degrees C. Bake it for 10 minutes and then turn the heat off and let the vase cool in the oven so it doesn't crack. You can also let the vase air dry, but that may take a while.

The paint is not waterproof, so make sure you don't fill the vase with water. But that opens you up to lots of creative options. You can create Designer Series Paper flowers, like we did, that coordinate with the gorgeous, glossy finish of the vase. Make one vase or create an entire set—it's an inexpensive and easy way to refresh your décor with the Stampin' Up! colors you love.

» Use a combination of ink from an ink refill and rubbing alcohol with your Stampin' Spritzer (item 126185). This combo ensures quick drying times.

» Create custom blossoms as we did here. First, cut out a couple of individual flowers from the Vanilla 5/8" Flower Trim (item 126869). Then make them any color you like by saturating them with color from our ink refills. Instant color!



» An ink pad and Brayer are ideal tools for dyeing raw products such as White Creped Filter Paper (item 129393). Here, our artist created a Pink Pirouette envelope in seconds.



» Create a beautiful ombre effect with our White Canvas Creations (item 129375) by following the steps below.

STEP 1. Fill a container with water. Add one drop of Island Indigo Ink Refill to the container. Blend the water and submerge the canvas for a few seconds.

STEP 2. Add two more drops of Island Indigo ink to the container and mix the water. Submerge two-thirds of the canvas and then remove it.

STEP 3. Add three more drops of Island Indigo ink to the container and mix the water. Submerge one-third of the canvas. Remove the Canvas Creations and let it dry. You can also use a Heat Tool for quicker drying.
