Paper Flowers

Four easy steps for making pretty paper flowers.

STEP 1: Punch five flowers from card stock.

Here we're using the **Blossom Punch** (item 125603) and **Tangerine Tango Card Stock** (item 111349), but this technique works for any flower variety. To get a different flower, try hand-cutting the flowers into the shape you want. You can also use the **Big Shot™ Die-Cutting Machine** (item 113439) to mass-produce your flowers.



STEP 2: Poke a hole in the center of each flower.

The hole is for the brad that we'll be attaching in step five. Here we're using the **Paper-Piercing Tool** (item 126189).



STEP 3: Spritz the flowers. This is important for getting the right texture when you scrunch the petals.

We use the **Stampin' Spritzer** (item 126185) to get it just right.



STEP 4: Layer the five flowers, attach a brad, and scrunch the flowers. Let the flower dry, and you're done!

These are our **Pumpkin Pie Brads** (item 119740).
